
Please do not let your child leave the vehicle without the assistance of an adult. We will do our best to attend to your child as promptly as possible, but where there are more children arriving than available staff members, there may be a short wait. If you would prefer to walk your child to the school door, you may park in the old carpark as before.

There have been a number of accidents on campus and I have witnessed near misses some mornings. *Please drive very slowly and with extreme caution*.

Pick-up time may be more challenging. The DDLETB, who own the campus, have requested that parents/carers do not leave their vehicles in the drop down areas, except for those with a parking permit. As

our pupils are too young to be allowed to leave the school unaccompanied, it would be helpful if you could continue to park in the old carpark at the back of the school until a safer arrangement if available.

A bike rack will be installed on our yard within the next week or two.
