# Gaelscoil Lir nominated as a DCU Changemaker School

Gaelscoil Lir has been nominated as a DCU Changemaker School.

DCU Changemaker Schools are schools that have been selected to work with the DCU Institute of Education to reimagine, co-create and lead transformation in education in Ireland by developing, amplifying, and sharing the skills of empathy, creativity, leadership, and teamwork.

We have been nominated as a DCU Changemaker School as our school has been recognised as innovative in our activities and transformative in our culture. It has been recognised that our school also develops the leadership skills of staff and students, has a student voice at the heart of all we do and is committed to creating systemic change in education.

Following on from Friendship Week last term, this term we focused on preventing bullying in our school. Classes revised what it is to be a good friend and what behaviour we welcome and celebrate in Gaelscoil Lir. Children were directly taught which behaviours are not acceptable in our school.

Teachers focused on the difference between being mean in an isolated incident and bullying itself. Appropriate language was taught and we worked on self-confidence with games and affirmations. Thanks to Ciara for organising a week of wonderful anti-bullying lessons for the whole school.

#### Gaeilge

From the end of term 2, we will expect the children from Naíonáin Mhóra – Rang 2 to use Gaeilge as a means of communication informally in class and on the school yard.
