New Board of Management

Thank you to our former Board of Management members for all their support and guidance over the past few years. They were instrumental in creating a positive, open and cooperative culture in Gaelscoil Lir that benefits our whole school community, but especially impacts our pupils.

As per the Governance Manual for Primary School, we were instructed to appoint a new board for the period 2023-2027. Attendance

All schools in Ireland must maintain attendance records for all students. The school principal is obliged to inform the Child and Family Agency's educational welfare services if a child between the ages 6-16 is absent for more than 20 days in a school year.

The principal must also inform the Child and Family Agency's educational welfare services if, in their view, a student has an attendance problem. This is a legal requirement and beyond the control of Gaelscoil Lir.

Following Covid, and the restrictions that were imposed, it is difficult for families to know when they should keep their child at home, or send them to school. Please find attached a document that reflects the current advice from NEPS (National Educational Psychological Services). Please use this as a guide when deciding whether or not to keep your child at home. If in doubt, please contact the school directly.

Punctuality

It is important for children to attend school on time every day. Core lessons are taught from 8:30 (Mathematics/Primary Language Curriculum). If a child

is regularly late for school, it creates gaps in their learning and limits their educational attainment.

Punctuality is also very important at home time. Children in infant classes must be collected at 1:10pm, all other classes need to be collected at 2:10pm. We understand that on occasion parents are unexpectedly delayed, but children become anxious and upset when they are collected late, especially if it is a regular occurrence.



Science Week

During Science week, we had lava lamps, volcanos, parachutes, eggs and food colouring all over the place. Scientist Emma did a lively show for us from Junior Einstein. Everyone enjoyed the active learning and we are very grateful to Michaela, Laura and Ciara for organising the activities and events.
